## **LEARN ABOUT THE ISSUES**

#### **Books**

- <u>Prison Ministry: Understanding Prison Culture</u>
  <u>Inside and Out</u>, by Lennie Spitale. This book covers the emotional challenges of prisoners and those who minister to them. Discusses the environment of fear, culture of deprivation, friendships between prisoners, guidelines, dos and don'ts, and many other essential topics for effective prison ministry.
- The Little Book of Restorative Justice, by Howard Zehr. This short and economical paperback (64 pages for under \$5.00) provides an easy to understand primer on the concept of restorative justice and how Western society views restorative versus criminal justice. Includes reflections on 9/11, the TRC in South Africa, & examples from US schools and workplaces.
- <u>Cain's Redemption</u>, by Dennis Shere. Formerly known as America's bloodiest prison, Louisiana's Angola State Penitentiary houses 5,000 inmates who have left regular knife fights for Bible studies. Longstanding Warden Burl Cain is a strong believer in the ability of the gospel to turn the most incorrigible of sinners into productive, moral citizens, and offers seminary classes and many other resources.
