20 Maxims of Congregational Vitality

1. Honor the past as a vehicle for change in the future.

I will remember the deeds of the Lord; yes, I will remember your miracles of long ago. Psalm 77:11

2. Pruning is painful but fruitful.

He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. John 15:2

3. It takes ten miles to turn a tanker: demonstrate hopeful perseverance.

Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord. Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. Romans 12:11-12

"...and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us." Hebrews 12:1

4. Pray like everything depends on God and work like everything depends on you.

We proclaim him, admonishing and teaching everyone with all wisdom, so that we may present everyone perfect in Christ. To this end I labor, struggling with all his energy, which so powerfully works in me. Col 1:28-29

Finally, brothers and sisters, pray for us that the message of the Lord may spread rapidly and be honored, just as it was with you. 2 Thess. 3:1

5. Plan the work and work the plan.

The plans of the diligent lead to profit as surely as haste leads to poverty. Proverbs 21:5

Make hay while the sun shines – that's smart; go fishing during the harvest -- that's stupid. Proverbs 10:7

6. Up the fun factor.

A cheerful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones. Proverbs 17:22

7. What you say "no" to may be more important than what you say "yes" to.

Simply let your 'Yes' be 'Yes,' and your 'No,' 'No; Matthew 5:37

8. Celebrate small wins and build momentum.

"My Father is always at his work to this very day, and I, too, am working."
John 5:17

9. Understand the family system without forgetting who you are.

10. It takes change to make change.

11. There is no vitality without reality: check your pulse.

12. It takes teamwork to make the dream work. * (John Maxwell)

14. Plant behind the plow.

20. You will be broken.
