PRACTICAL WAYS TO LEAD THIS VISION

- · Share a Story of Renewal: Testimonies of how God is at work in your own life or in your ministry can inspire others to seek renewal themselves.
- Host a Vision Night: Gather leaders and congregation members for an evening of worship, prayer, and storytelling focused on renewal.
- Facilitate Prayer Gatherings: Lead times of corporate prayer that invite God's Spirit to move in fresh and powerful ways.
- Encourage Lifelong Discipleship: Provide opportunities for people to deepen their faith journey through study, mentoring, and service.
- Model Renewal in Leadership: Let your humility, joy, and dependence on God speak louder than your words.

ENGAGING CONGREGATIONS IN RENEWAL

- Invite Participation: Encourage your congregation to join in prayer, reflection, and service projects that embody renewal.
- Celebrate Stories: Regularly highlight moments of transformation in worship, newsletters, and personal conversations.
- Empower Leaders: Equip emerging leaders to carry the vision of renewal into small groups, ministries, and mission.
- Create Rhythms of Renewal: Build intentional practices into the life of the church of retreat, sabbath, fasting, or community engagement.
