

#### "2025 RESOLUTION ON HUMANITARIAN AID"

The 140th Annual Meeting of the Evangelical Covenant Church affirms the essential humanitarian work that many governments provide, acknowledges that work as one way we carry out our Lord's command to love our neighbor, grieves the preventable suffering and loss that will result when such funds are cut, and humbly encourages and implores governments to consider the restoration of the life-saving funding where it has been reduced, and expansion of such funding wherever possible. Throughout this year as Covenant World Relief & Development has interacted with our global partners, a common theme has come up: the impact of the changes to US foreign aid around the world. The stories take different forms. In Laos, cuts in funding have led to stoppage of mine clearing, leaving farmers and their families at great risk. In Kenya, reduced food rations in refugee camps have led to violence and further displacement. In Ecuador, entire agencies have shuttered, creating a massive stress on our partners working for justice and peace.

At Gather 2025, the Covenant's Annual Meeting, in Orlando, Florida, the assembly directly addressed the topic of changes to foreign aid. In this topic, we witnessed a powerful moment when two CWRD partners—Rev. Mathew Jock Moses from South Sudan and Rev. Jyotirmaya Deep (pictured above) from India—stood before the assembly and spoke with courage and conviction. Representing sister Covenant churches that are committed to carrying out disaster responses and community development, both leaders told of the painful impact that recent cuts to humanitarian aid are having in the communities they serve.

Their words were not only testimony to hardship, but a prophetic reminder that we are bound together as one body in Christ. As we listened to their words, the truth became clear that the global church does not exist at the margins of our life together. It speaks into the very center of who we are and who God is calling us to be.

As we celebrate CWRD's 80 years of ministry, we carry with us the witness of Pastor Mathew and Pastor Jyotirmaya as well as the many other partners they represent. This newsletter focuses on the ways in which we have partnered specifically in disaster response in the past year with the hope that we can enter into ever deeper solidarity with these efforts around the world.

THE CYCLE OF DISASTER, TOGETHER WE EMPOWER CHANGE

# CWRD partners walk with communities to rebuild after war, famine, and disaster.

In the past year, the world faced both new as well as ongoing disasters that impacted every region of our earth. Partner organizations with courageous local leaders and committed teams bring relief to those in the middle of these crises, attending to the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of those suffering. Together with these partners, the Covenant has joined in responding to **cholera outbreaks**, **violent conflicts and war**, **cyclones**, **earthquakes**, **and floods**. Additionally, efforts have addressed the secondary impacts of crisis such as **hunger**, **displacement**, **and emotional trauma**. The following are examples of the 15 disaster responses in 11 different countries that were part of CWRD's efforts in the past year.

#### Colombia

In Medellin, Colombia, thousands of cubic meters of earth were released from a mountain slope because of intense rains that fell in the area this summer. The most severely impacted areas were densely populated, highly vulnerable neighborhoods in the upper portions of the hills surrounding the city. Shalom Corporation, a new CWRD partner, was already serving the community and ready to respond in a collaborative method together with physical, emotional, and spiritual care.

COLOMBIA

## **Democratic Republic of Congo**

Violence brought on by the M23 group continues to wreak havoc in the streets of Goma. Partner AGIR-RDC has been working through community development projects in the region and has also responded to the waves of violence by providing physical and emotional care for those displaced and traumatized by the ongoing violence.



Natural disasters often impact the most vulnerable communities. Many of our partners are working to help communities prepare, respond, and rebuild.



Emotional care for those displaced and traumatized by violence is central to the work of many of our partners, including AGIR-DRC in Goma.



In addition to these disaster responses, this year Covenant World Relief and Development is partnering in 50 community development projects through 34 partnerships in 20 different countries around the world.

#### Palestine/Isreal

Two years of combat in Gaza have resulted in devastating loss of life as well as mass displacement and hunger. Additionally, the West Bank has felt the indirect impact of the conflict as 47% of the population faces unemployment. The Shepherd Society has been able to help run a clinic (though often without sufficient medicines) and helps to offset the economic tragedy through job creation.



As war in Ukraine drags on, the response to those impacted has evolved over the past 3+ years. This has been one of CWRD's largest disaster responses in our 80-year history and has included partnering with an amazing variety of organizations such as Medical Teams International, Hope International Ministries, Asociatia Echiparea Liderilor Pentru Succes (The Equipping Leaders for Success Association), WeCare Centers, and of course, World Relief International, CWRD's longest-standing partner. The care provided has included building shelters for families, medical care for those dealing with chronic illness, job training and placement in host countries, and an increasing emphasis on counseling and trauma care as the emotional toll increases over time.



#### Nepal

In Nepal, heavy rain and hailstorms devastated entire communities with flooding and landslides. Fortunately, partners Shanti Nepal and Nepal Christian Relief Services were working even before crisis struck by creating healthy communities resilient to disaster. When the storms hit, our partners and their communities were prepared and organized to respond, collaboratively rebuilding infrastructure including clean water systems.

#### India

When flash floods wiped out communities in northern India, long-time partner and sister denomination, Hindustani Covenant Church (HCC) was prepared to deliver aid to even the most remote regions. HCC provided supplies essential to survival in the moment of crisis and followed up with emotional care for the ongoing trauma that was experienced in the harrowing disaster.



#### **Northeast Africa**

Across Sudan, South Sudan, and Ethiopia, people have faced multi-layered crises that include brutal civil war, gender-based violence, outbreaks of cholera, as well has natural disaster in the form of flooding and landslides. Our sister denominations the ECC of South Sudan & Ethiopia and the ECC of Kenya are caring for the displaced by providing food and shelter to those who have had to flee their homes. This includes both emergency aid as well as programs designed to build healthy communities for the long-term through community gardening and education.




