India



Here is the story of Nitesh who receives care from the India

for Christ Ministry (IFCM) Nitesh is 5 years old. He comes from a very poor family of 7 children (3 girls and 4 boys). His father is a mason who spends his days drinking and does not provide for the family. They live in a small shelter on a plot of land. One day,

their landlord told the family to vacate the premises. They were literally thrown out of their home and were standing on the road with their belongings. There was no one to care for them. During this time, workers from IFCM encouraged them and shared with them the love of God. Nitesh and two of his sisters were taken into the IFCM Child Development Centre. The family trusted God and immediately the Lord changed their circumstances. Now they have a place to stay and the Lord has been wonderfully taking care of this family. The children are being cared for through the IFCM CDC.

Congo

Elizabeti is a 9 year old girl who lives in Gemena with her family.

She helps her mother with her small sewing business but often wears previously-worn dresses from North America. Elizabeti likes to sing and dance with other children in the church choir. Traditionally girls like Elizabeti would not have the opportunity to go to school or learn to read. Because of the Congo Covenant Church (CEUM) and Covenant Kids Elizabeti attends school and studies language and math skills. She has a bright smile and a bright future.

Colombia

Margaret Mohr, a member of Rolling Hills Covenant and long time Covenant Kids supporter, writes, "It was almost a year ago when I received a letter that changed my attitude toward Covenant Kids. I had been sponsoring a child for many years—a string of children, in fact. 15 years ago the Lord prompted me to sponsor a child. At times I would get a new child, with the one I had been sponsoring getting too old for the program or moving out of the area.

"Yet each month I sent off a donation, to provide for a little person. I kept their photo on my bulletin board and prayed for them often.

"Then the letter came. It was signed Edwin Diaz, and told how Covenant Kids helped him to develop as a person, and also helps the Colombian Church as a whole since many children grow spiritually through it. He is now a Pastor in another Covenant Church in Cali, Colombia.

"I racked my brain when I got the letter; it had been a long time since I had read that name. And then I remembered the photo of the studious looking little boy who I prayed for many years ago

"What an awesome God we have, to take the little monthly amount of money and the prayers that I aim His way, and make something beautiful out of them!

"Now I look at the photo of Cindy Carolina, who I have sponsored for 2 years, and I see the possibilities. I have confidence that God is building His values into her through the Covenant Kids program."

Sudan



Abraham Othow Adwok is a young boy from Bentiu, Sudan.

He lives with his mother and siblings in a small, one room house called a tukul. These homes are made of sticks, mud, and straw. Abraham attends the second session of school each day at Good Hope Academy. In the morning he helps his mother with chores. He also shines shoes to help with families' living expenses. Going to school is giving Abraham a chance to learn to read. Scholarships given through Covenant Kids provide school supplies and teachers' salaries at Good Hope Academy.

Churches involved with Covenant Kids

First Covenant Church Seattle, WA

First Covenant of Seattle, WA featured Covenant Kids as their mission focus for VBS in 2009. Each day children

learned what it means to be a Covenant Kid. They identified the four different countries on



a map and tasted snacks from each country; although they skipped a snack entirely as they studied Sudan. They also heard testimonies of God's work through Covenant Kids and collected coins as an offering.

Associate Pastor Carolyn Poterek reports that kids from a variety of income levels all contributed to the offering. "They were proud to give to kids who have less than we do in Seattle"

They collected \$130 in a large jar and gave it as an offering the following Sunday. Kids emptied their piggy banks and even picked up coins off the street as gifts for God's Kingdom.
