## Stories of need meet the work of God's love through Covenant Kids

**Danvir, Liabana, Nyamoch Rout and Jose Andres: four of God's children in four different countries have unique faces, families and personalities. Yet their needs for care and education are equally profound. God's love reaches these children through Covenant Kids scholarships. Read their stories below.**

### India

 On a warm Sunday morning in Bangalore, India 4 year old Danvir tugged on the pants of Pastor Paul Devakumar. "Will you pray for me?" the young boy asked. "I will," replied the tall man, "but what do you really want?" With downcast eyes Danvir explained his need.

A couple of weeks ago, out of desperation, his father had poured kerosene over the entire family as they slept. He drenched the young boy, his mother, his elder sister and baby sister. He then covered himself with kerosene and started a fire. Danvir had managed to escape along with his mother and the baby. Sadly, his elder sister and father died in the fire.

Danvir continued, "My mom has now gone to work with a family. They will let her live there with my baby sister but they won't let me stay. I've been sleeping under the tree outside the temple. Will you pray for me that I will find a place to stay?"

Danvir's message tugged at Paul Devakumar's heart that Sunday morning and he offered him nurturing care and education. Because of Danvir Rev. Devakumar realized that many of the children who came to Sunday school each week were in such need. He began the Child Development Centres through India for Christ Ministries. Everyday

Danvir, and children just like him, receive education and care through these ministry centres.

## Colombia



Jose Andres is in first grade this year but is very behind in his studies. His mom Valentina, is a single-parent who cleans houses to support her three children. She could not afford to buy him a uniform earlier in the year so he missed several months of instruction. Jose Andres recently received a donated uniform and school supplies from the church and can now attend school. He also goes to the after-

## Sudan



Nyamoch Rout and her family had been walking for a day already. At seven years old she was now expected to carry some of the grains they received from aid workers in the next town over. She had been excited to help out with this task but was now feeling hot and tired. She, her mother and sisters had only stopped twice

during the heat of the day to rest in the tall grasses along the road. They still had a day left to go. Nyamoch Rout could not wait to get back to school at Good Hope Academy. She loves listening to the lessons, singing songs and seeing her friends. The teachers at Good Hope Academy teach stories and truths from the Bible along with reading and math. Nyamoch Rout's family knows that her future will be better because she is able to go to school.

## Congo



It is four o'clock in the afternoon and Liabana and her friends have just finished school. They giggle and laugh as they walk out of the classroom and into the bright sunlit day. Their classroom is a cement building with an aluminum roof. The students sit on simple wooden desks and there is a single, black chalkboard at the front of the room. Liabana and her friends are young teenagers. Other girls their age are beginning to get married and have children but these girls would like to keep studying for a while. Liabana says, "I am glad that I get to study and I hope that someday I can help others with the things I am learning in school." Scholarship funds from Covenant Kids make it possible for them to continue their education and take exit exams from secondary school. They are gaining confidence, knowledge and hope in Christ.
