1.	Leaders actively advocate and encourage intergenerational worship and leadership that includes all the generations.			
2.	Leaders plan each worship service, with all generations in mind.			
3.	Attention is paid to inclusive vocabulary that children as well as adults can understand.			
4.	Sermon illustrations include references to all generations, including children and youth.			
5.	A sensitivity toward the needs of each generation is considered within prayer elements.			
6.	Movement is strategically planned in each worship service (standing, praising, greeting, coming forward, etc.).			
7.	"Kid friendly" experiential elements are included, such as improvisational drama, prayer practices, dance, and prayer stations.			
8.	Attention is given to the amount of time allotted for each worship element and the attention span of children, youth, and adults.			
9.	We provide resources and classes to equip parents to help their children worship.			
10.	The congregation is educated on how to encourage and affirm children in worship.			
11.	Consideration is given to helping prepare children, youth, and adults to serve as worship leaders.			
12.	All generations, including children and youth, serve as prayer leaders.			
13.	All generations, including children and youth, serve as Scripture readers.			
14.	All generations, including children and youth, serve as ushers.			
15.	All generations, including children and youth, serve as greeters.			
16.	All generations, including children and youth, serve through music.			
17.	All generations, including children and youth, serve through drama or dance.			
18.	All generations, including children and youth, serve in set up and take down.			
19.	All generations, including children and youth, serve through AV or through other technical ministries.			
20.	All generations, including children and youth, serve within a creative worship planning team.			
21.	All generations have the opportunity to share their continuing stories of faith.			
22.	Our worship leaders reflect the entire priesthood of believers.
