What is Christian Formation?

Christian formation is our continuing journey of being transformed by the Holy Spirit towards the likeness of Christ, experiencing and expressing love for God and others.

(See also Romans 8:29 and 2 Corinthians 3:17-18)

A Philosophical Shift

Historically, the church has provided a learning environment based in large part on the public educational system. As a result, the focus has leaned more towards head knowledge rather than a heart change, one that would be evident in a visible and continual life change. As leaders, we need to provide a new perspective and create a new environment in which the Spirit can work to transform lives.

This requires a philosophical shift in our way of planning for ministry in three areas - shifting from...

- 1. A primary focus on *program* to a focus on *transformation*.
- 2. A primarily <u>segmented</u> to a more <u>integrated and holistic</u> environment.
- 3. Emphasis on the *head* (or the cognitive dimension of learning) to an integration of *head, heart* <u>and hands.</u>
