People to Be Loved: Why Homosexuality Is Not Just an Issue with Preston Sprinkle

Embrace webinar #1 summary:

Author and founder of The Center for Faith, Sexuality, and Gender, Dr. Preston Sprinkle speaks to the need to love LGBT+ people with theological faithfulness and courageous love. Key takeaways and timestamps from webinar:

(5:30-10:30): Preston tells his life-changing journey of getting to know LGBT+ people. Relational proximity humanizes gender and sexuality conversations.

(10:30-15:00): Why is it so important for the Church to love LGBT+ people? Because it is one of the most significant ethical questions facing the church, the number of people impacted, the witness of the church, and spiritual hunger of LGBT+ people.

(15:00-22:00): There is a great need for church leaders and parents to be **educated and equipped** in how to love LGBT+ who come out so they do not inflict more trauma, shame, and suicidal ideation.

(22:30-29:00): The Church does not need to modify its theology from traditional to affirming to truly love LGBT+ people (see "Us vs. Us" for the research behind this).

(29:00-36:00): Everyone is created in the image of God; at the same time, everyone's sexuality has been impacted by the fall. Regardless of our natural orientations or desires, we are each called to live into the Creator's design.



(37:00-40:30): Learning from Jesus who both preached high moral standards and embodied love towards people who fell short of those standards (Matthew 5-9), especially people in marginalized groups.

(40:30-45:00): Practical ways the church has loved LGBT+ people, including: response to Pulse nightclub shootings, outreach to homeless teens, and raising awareness of bullying within schools.
