Advocating to End World Hunger

More than 821 million people suffer from food insecurity, and over 40 million are in danger of starvation, according to the UN World Food Program USA. Violent conflict, extreme climate shocks, gender inequality, and food waste are the major drivers of the world hunger crisis. Covenant World Relief and Development partners with grassroots organizations to address hunger. We also engage in advocacy to end world hunger through our partnership with Bread for the World.

Bread for the World is a nonpartisan Christian organization that works with leaders of Congress to combat hunger internationally and domestically.

The president of Bread for the World, Eugene Cho, is an ordained Covenant minister and church planter with a heart for the poor. He will speak at the Covenant Midwinter Conference in January 2024. Adam Edgerly recently joined Eugene at a Bread for the World board meeting in Washington DC and participated in advocacy meetings with congressional staffers.

Bread is currently pushing for strategic provisions within the US Farm Bill, which is up for its five-year renewal this year. The Farm Bill is the largest US policy initiative addressing hunger. Determining which provisions are included in this bill will dramatically impact the future of global and domestic access to nutritious food. Your voice can help to influence policies and save lives. FREE Initiative Raises Voice for Change

For more than a decade, Covenant World Relief and Development has directly partnered in anti-sex trafficking efforts, specifically in India. With the 2021 launch of FREE, the Covenant's collaborative anti-sex trafficking initiative, the scope of partnerships has increased to include 10 projects in the US and around the world.

In October Ramelia Williams, director of ministry initiatives for Love Mercy Do Justice, and Prajakta David, director of global advancement and mobilization, traveled to Washington DC to represent the FREE initiative on Capitol Hill. They engaged in meetings where they urged legislators and their staff to act against this crime. In these meetings, they advocated for policy changes such as the Eliminating Abusive and Rampant Neglect of Interactive Technologies (EARN IT) Act, legislation that would strengthen cyber tip line reporting, give survivors legal recourse against online platforms that broadcast their abuse, update terminology used in US Code to reflect

the true nature of this exploitive and abusive crime, and establish a national commission of stakeholders to identify strategies to combat Online Sexual Exploitation of Children (OSEC).
