#### **Caring for Children Through Community**


Story from a CWR partner in East Asia

Eight-year-old Gi\* casually flipped through the book in her hand, but looked around absently, as if she was not used to this strange environment. With eyes full of anticipation, she willingly came when I gestured my welcome for her to come talk to me. We began a very frank and open



conversation and I learned that this little girl was abandoned by her mother and now lives with her elderly grandparents because her father works far away. As I listened to her, my eyes teared up thinking about how she was only eight years old and had experienced such things. A child this age should be carefree, but her ease and confidence in talking made me suddenly feel that the school of life had taught her so much. I could see that even though she is a child left behind by her single parent, she is a strong little girl who is full of hope and confidence. She told me that although she is lonely, she likes puppies, drawing, and sleeping. At the community center, Gi found other children to play with and books to read. As she played on our community center's small wooden rocking horse, seeming to be one hundred percent happy, she looked at me and said, "Auntie, if you are my mother, that would be good!" I had all sorts of mixed feelings in my heart. I gave her a hug and said to her, "The community center is your home; I will love you like a mother!"

## Yemen: Facing the World's Largest Humanitarian Crisis

Yemen is on the brink of experiencing the world's worst famine in 100 years. Due to ongoing conflict in Yemen, sustainable food sources are being destroyed and aid agencies are struggling to reach families with emergency supplies. More than 17.8 million men, women, and children in Yemen lack access to clean water. Poor sanitation conditions contribute to waterborne diseases. Already Yemen is experiencing the largest cholera outbreak in recorded history.

A Covenant World Relief partner in Yemen is stengthening the resilience of



vulnerable households and communities in three ways: by improving the local water infrastructure, raising awareness, and strengthening local capacity for maintaining the installed systems for rainwater harvesting. This project impacts 360 households through restoring cisterns in 7 rural communities, installing rainwater harvesting systems on rooftops of households, and distributing water filters.

Our CWR partner (left unnamed for security reasons), is establishing water committees in each rural community. These local water committees are trained to manage and maintain the cisterns, and will be better able to advocate for improved access to water through the local authorities. Additionally, each household is trained on water hygiene and ways to prevent waterborne diseases, as well as how to maintain the water filters and rainwater harvesting systems. Please continue to pray for peace and our ongoing response in Yemen.



### A Better Future for Families in Honduras

CWR Director David Husby met Porfiria and Mercedes during a recent visit with CWR partner, Cocepradil, in Honduras. When Porfiria was asked how their lives have changed since the water system was completed through the labor of the whole community, her answer was, "Everything has changed!" She went on to share that since she doesn't have to fetch water multiple times a day, she is able to spend more time improving their home and working with her husband, Mercedes, on their small farm. Her children have been able to focus more on their studies. Another major impact has been improved health for their family since they now have access to clean water.

Porfiria and Mercedes are currently participating in the CWR-funded food security program that focuses on improved agricultural techniques, diversification of crops, nutrition, sanitation, and health. One of the activities of the program is to draw a poster with three sections that portrays their house and surrounding property in the past, the present, and their dreams for the future. Porfiria and Mercedes are thankful to God for all of the changes in their family so far, but they believe that with God's help the changes will continue into the future.

# Water: A Precious Resource in Somaliland

For people who live in Somaliland, there is no resource more precious than water. There are no natural lakes or rivers in all of Somaliland and drilling wells is not feasible for those living anywhere near the coast since the well water is usually brackish.

CWR is engaged with our local partner to help communities more effectively catch and hold rainwater to last through the long dry season. In 2017 there was an extended drought. CWR provided funds for tanker trucks from the capital city of Hargeisa to bring much needed water. Unfortunately, most of the livestock died that year due to lack of water. However, many human lives were saved through that emergency intervention of providing water.

In addition to water, the CWR funded program focuses on sustainable agriculture and women's empowerment through Self



Help Groups (SHGs). The women in these SHGs regularly save and receive microloans to start small businesses. With increased income the women are better able to provide much needed food, water, and medical care for their families. We are deeply grateful for all who have given and continue to give to Project Blue and to the CWR general fund so that ten communities in Somaliland are better able to sustain themselves. *Learn more and give at CovChurch.org/ProjectBlue.*




