Educational Objectives	 At the end of the class today, the children will be able to: 1. Defining God's forgiveness. 2. Explain how God can get our attention as this teaching. 3. Say the key memory verse. 			

Life Application

God reminded the people of Israel not to obey other gods but Him. However, King Manasseh surrendered to false gods and practices. So God decided to strongly discipline for disobedience Manasseh giving opportunity to repent and acknowledge him as their God. In this week children will write in their take-home sheet, ways to practice forgiveness and pray for those they need to forgive as God forgives.

INSTRUCTIONS

Review: Invite children to share the good choices they made this week. If they have brought their sheets, they may place them in their folders after the discussion. Briefly review the previous class. Reminding them of the good choices Joash made with the help of God and his good friend the Priest Jehoiada, and the bad choices he made when he listened to those who did not follow God.

My GROW Adventure with God Weekly Review: As children enter take time to have them reflect on their adventure with God booklets and either discuss or use art materials to express their journey during the past week. You may wish to add any art work, written poems, prayers or songs to a GROW wall in the room. You can find my GROW Adventure with God materials on the Covchurch.org website in the same place as the Adventures with God sessions.

Opening Prayer: Gather children around a candle. Light the candle and explain that we are entering into a special time with God. Encourage the children to hold their hands out in front of them palms up as a sign they are ready to receive what God has for them today.

Prayer Example: Lord God, thank you for making us, for loving us, for forgiving us, and guiding us. We know you are here with us right now. As we enter into your word, the Bible, help us draw close to you, to understand and to listen to what you have to say to us. Amen

(For safety sake, you may wish to extinguish the candle after the prayer)

Bible Reading: Explain that as we read the Bible we do that first to spend time with God. Children can remain with hands out stretched palms up to receive the word as it's being read. Alternatively they can be invited to draw what they hear. Read the key verse Bible passage for the day two times and ask children to respond.

Question examples: What did you notice in this passage? How does it make you feel? Was there anything you would ask God about that you didn't understand or was confusing? Is God saying anything to you though the verse?



Bible Exploration: Have children open to 2 Chronicles 33:1-16. Read 2 Chronicles 33:1-6, 9

Discuss: Children may want to look at or color the illustration (page 6) while discussing the story.

- 1. What are your 1st thoughts?
- 2. Is there anything you find confusing?
- 3. What is Manasseh like? Why do you think he reconstructed the evil things his father had destroyed?
- 4. What is it that makes us do the wrong thing that may even hurt others?

Read: 2 Chronicles 33:10-16

Discuss:

- 1. Do you have questions for God about this passage?
- 2. How does God try and help the people?
- 3. What does he allow to happen to Manasseh and the people?
- 4. We often ask for forgiveness but repentance means really changing doing the opposite of the wrong we were doing. Do you think Manasseh repented? Why?
- 5. What does this story tell you about God?

Craft: Make copies of the heart illustration. Give the children a piece of red construction paper to trace her heart. When done, children can decorate the heart any way they want, but in the center of the heart write The Lord Spoke (2 Chronicles 33:10).

Provide glue, colored paper, markers, pencils or any other material you have on hand. When the heart is finished, help them to punch two holes in the sides of the top to attach a piece of yarn to make a necklace or sign.

As you work on this, remind them that many things in our lives we would avoid if indeed we listened to God and loved God with our hearts, just as God loves us. At first Manasseh did not listen to God. But later he had a change of heart, loved God and followed God.



Conclusions: In conclusion, emphasize the duty we have to obey the voice of God and keep His commandments without God having to discipline harshly. Remind them also that God's forgiveness is complete, total in our lives. Never reminding us of our sin.

Today's GROW Adventure with God Review:

G: God's Word: What is the story? (give children an opportunity to express their understanding of the story)

R: Relationships: Is there anything in today's bible story that shows us how we should or shouldn't share God's love with others? (Remind children that sometimes God uses the stories of the bible to show us how we shouldn't act toward God or others and give them a chance to consider how we might show God's love instead)

O: Outward Action: Is there anything in the bible story that shows us how we should help or serve God or others? (Explore concrete ways the children could live this out in the coming week)

W: Worship: Is there anything in the bible story that shows us how we should accept God's love for us and others? Ask: How do you feel about God? How would you like to respond to God? What would you like to say to God?

Closing Prayer: Gather children around the candle again. As you light the candle explain that the flame is something that is present in the light and the darkness. In the same way, it reminds us that God is always with us. Is there anything anyone wishes to say to God? After children have responded, close the prayer time.


