Midwinter is designed for retired and active pastors and spouses, staff ministers, missionaries, NPTS and CHET students, chaplains, and institutional leaders, as well as lay persons, students, and pastors exploring future ministry in the Evangelical Covenant Church.

New for 2014

Connections Day (Tuesday)

Connections Day is rooted in themes emerging from participant evaluations in recent years, specifically reasons for attending Midwinter and desired experiences. Afternoon roundtables and affinity groups will help you connect with colleagues sharing common interests, passions, and concerns. During the afternoon general session, President Gary Walter will present a mission and ministry overview, followed by ECC ministry breakout sessions where you will meet staff and learn about available resources and services.

Prayer Studio (All week)

The Prayer Studio is a place to pray, to innovate, and to experiment with the art of prayer and with other spiritual practices. Heather Monkmeyer, spiritual director and pastor, will lead the Prayer Studio. The studio is available on your own or in the context of community throughout Midwinter. There will be different guided spiritual practice experiences throughout the day so that you can try something new with others. If you miss the gathered experience, there will be space for solitude and prayer, as well as supplies and guides to take with you to deepen your own individual experience. You can come whenever it fits your schedule and decide how you want to spend your time.

Fitness Suite (All week)

Over the years we have learned how deeply physical health is connected to our overall well-being. In considering the question "what is the good life?" we believe the answer must involve not only the soul and mind, but the body as well. As we keep our bodies in good health, encouraging them to work as God intended, we honor his creation.

The Physical Fitness Suite options include total body workouts, instruction related to specific areas of the body, guided relaxation, core conditioning, personal training sessions, lectures on physical spirituality, Zumba classes, and marathon training.

This suite will be led by Cortney Wall, certified personal trainer at Galter Life Center in Chicago, and Ben Steel, a certified personal trainer and youth pastor at Hope Covenant Church in Crystal Lake, Illinois. 
