## HUNGER KNOWS NO SEASON

During the holiday season we are filled with gratitude for all of the blessings God gives us. We thank him for our families, for abundant food, for health, and for so many other things. It is during this time that many of us also think about those who are poor and marginalized. Covenant World Relief receives the vast majority of our donations in November and December. We are extremely grateful

for all who give so generously during this time so that the lives of the vulnerable can be transformed.

However, the reality is that hunger has no season. While traveling in remote rural areas of India recently, I met low caste and outcaste people (Dalits) who struggle year-round just to survive. I met the man in the photo to the right who hasn't been able adequately provide for the needs of his family. He is one of nearly one billion people in the world who live on less than one dollar a day. Now because of a small loan from a CWR-sponsored project, he was able to rent a small piece of property and grow peanuts. With this cash crop he will be able to buy food for his family and continue to farm the land.

Covenant World Relief responds to disasters and supports long-term community development projects among the most vulnerable all year long. ## WHEN DISASTER STRIKES

When major disasters strike, like in Haiti and Japan, we know within moments that our partners are responding and that Covenanters will be giving generously. When CWR responds to disasters, you can stay updated through our Twitter, Facebook, blog, website, and Covenant news stories. Within one day of major disasters, and often within hours, we will be communicating through these avenues and will make online giving options available.

Smaller disasters take place almost daily throughout the world. For these smaller disasters, Covenant World Relief must evaluate whether or not to respond. Several factors are important in this decision. The first question we ask is, "Does CWR have a partner in the area that will be responding?" We also consider whether the disaster affects the most vulnerable and whether Covenanters will be giving to this effort.

How can you best be involved in disaster response? You should know that your financial donation does make a difference. At least 90 percent of your donation to CWR for disaster response will go directly to the project. Cash donations can be used immediately to purchase critically needed items.

Donations to the CWR general disaster fund are the first gifts used after a disaster. By "banking" these funds, you allow us to respond immediately. These funds are also used to respond to smaller disasters that affect the most vulnerable but never make headlines.

Immediately after a disaster, please pray for those who have been affected and for the aid workers. Inform your church and family about the situation and ask them to pray as well.

Although we all like to be involved hands-on, going to the disaster zone and sending items generally is not the best way to help. Disaster response is a highly technical and sensitive effort. Professionals with specialized skills and experience in disaster situations are best suited to respond. If volunteers or specific items are needed, we will communicate those needs on our website, Facebook, and Twitter.

Covenant World Relief is committed to long-term community development, not just immediate relief. Disaster relief saves lives, and community development forever changes lives. In all disaster response, we hope that relief will lead to long-term transformational development. CWR is committed to stay after the disaster.
