We have two partners, KARM, a knoxville homeless shelter, and Beardsley Community Farm, who will provide 4 different service learning opportunities for the students at CHIC. EVENING DINNER & WORSHIP SERVICE

Departs from Thompson Bowling Arena at 2:45 PM

Homelessness is one of the biggest issues plaguing the Knoxville area. During CHIC we're going to work to meet the needs of this population by giving back to the Knoxville community which graciously hosts us triennially. Come join us as we take over the evening feeding and worship service responsibilities of this local homeless shelter. Youth will have the opportunity to administer worship services nightly. Youth groups have the opportunity to come as worship bands or service teams to partner in this ministry, and each night a preselected student will be allowed to deliver a homily during this time. After this, youth will serve meals, busing tables, washing dishes, and partake in table fellowship with the homeless population being served during mealtimes. KARM feeds the homeless population of Knoxville three square meals a day, every day of the year, and also provides housing. In fact, KARM is the only homeless facility in Knoxville which provides housing for in tact family units.

To be intentional about serving the least of these, because what we do unto them, we likewise do unto God. So through this project we want to stretch youth to see God's face and presence within the homeless, the least of these amongst us today. We want them to be emboldened to communicate their faith in word and deed through this outreach of love occurring outside of any holiday season.
