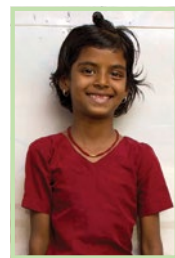
South Sudan

Pray for Aliza, a thirteen-year-old girl from the Muslim Dinka tribe who lost her mother and father due to the Sudan civil war. While violence has decreased dramatically, outbreaks of violence have continued, leaving many of the elderly, the sick, women, and children like Aliza extremely vulnerable. Through the ministry of the Covenant, she and her grandmother have become underground Christians who receive encouragement from the Bible. She wrote to us saying, "I thank you for the support that has transformed my life and helped shape my future destiny. In my studying, I want to

become a medical doctor who can help the children and mothers who may die during delivery. I would also treat all the poor and beggars free of charges, and care for hungry people in the village." Aliza's grandmother also thanks the Covenant for transforming lives regardless of their religion, tribe, gender, or age, and said that it was the first time she saw such generous people helping others freely, even if they were from other religions.

Seven-year-old Mamta Pawra smiles because she has a family. But just four years ago, she did not. One day, villagers realized

that two young girls were alone in their hut and after inquiring, they found out that the girls' father and mother had deserted them. Mamta (age three at the time) and her younger sister Roshni (age one), struggled alone in that small hut until staff members of the Hindustani Covenant Church brought them to Chopda. Church member Omkar Pawra adopted both girls and nursed them back to health. Once swollen, thin, and abandoned, Mamta now has an energetic smile that expresses deep thanks for the special people who have contributed to bringing positive change in her and her sister's life.
