## DR Congo

Esther, her husband, and their two children live in Karawa, about 30 miles east of Gemena. "Before World Vision came to our community," Esther said, "I would fetch water from a spring in the bush three kilometers [nearly two miles] from my house. This spring was the same place where people came to take a bath."

Esther and her family often suffered water-related illnesses, including stomachaches, typhoid, and diarrhea. They struggled with financial stress due to the many hospital visits.

At church one day, Esther learned that World Vision was planning to develop the Ndoabili spring. "My heart trembled with joy," she said. "I kept praying that it would be successful."

Now Esther can access clean water close to her home. "Today I am very happy. God has heard my prayer. This is a sustainable solution for our health. I can draw water whenever I want because it is permanent."



### India

Sifa's studies were disrupted when poverty and struggles forced her and her family to migrate from Karnataka to Pune.

One day Sifa met the teacher of the center run by Covenant Social Services, which helped with admission for a

nearby school. Now Sifa is in the seventh grade. She is very active in class and is developing strong leadership skills.

The Covenant Kids programs support vulnerable children with items such as school uniforms, books, pens, shoes, counseling services, peer Christian fellowship, and free education. Nyanaath and her mother are loyal members of the **Evangelical Covenant Church of South** Sudan and Ethiopia (ECCSSE). With support from the church, Nyanaath just began grade 12.

Nyanaath dreams of becoming a pilot when she finishes her studies.
