

Journey Covenant Church

Journey Covenant Church was originally established in 1952 in a family home. Rapid growth led to the construction of a “parsonage-chapel” in 1954 and then a full-fledged church building in 1958 with the support of conference financing, Frontier Friends donations, and congregational giving.

After several decades of growth and vitality, a series of pastoral changes and vacancies led to a significant drop in attendance and a reduced focus on outreach.

In 2000, a new pastor challenged the congregation to focus on missional outreach. We experienced controversy about abandoning traditional practices for contemporary approaches, including replacing pews with removable seating in order to use the sanctuary as a multipurpose gathering space. Attendance dropped dramatically. When the pastor left in 2006, the remaining members considered dissolving the congregation.

Yet after prayer and reflection, the congregation sensed God leading them to continue. The church changed its name and recommitted itself to missional ministry and outreach. Participating in Covenant’s congregational vitality process led us to establish the Christ Kitchen meal program, a cornerstone for other outreach ministries. In November 2008, we called Phil Engle to be our pastor, largely due to his commitment to evangelical outreach.

Subsequently we have experienced renewed growth—which has brought attention to the limitations and deficiencies of our aging physical plant. Most significantly, we lack wheelchair accessible restrooms and overall building accessibility, our nursery and restroom facilities are outdated, and our storage facilities are insufficient to allow the effective conversion of the sanctuary from a worship space to a multifunctional ministry area. Our current project (the first phase of a long-term building rehabilitation plan) will remedy those deficiencies to make Journey Covenant Church more inviting to visitors and more practical for our expanding ministry efforts.
