covenant kids ministry

Covenant Kids Ministries will be offered for those with children at the Annual Meeting. A group of specialists who minister with children has been brought together from around the country to create a caring formation environment for children. Teamed with an amazing group of volunteers, children will receive loving care, attention, and opportunities to explore, reflect, play, serve, create, and worship.

All children must be pre-registered. If you know of children who will be joining us for only part of the program, please check availability at the registration and information table when you arrive. On-site registration will only be available as space permits.

Age Groups

Shepherds Fold (Nursery-Toddler): A safe place for babies and toddlers where every child receives loving attention and care and where toddlers are encouraged to explore, engage, and discover in the midst of their play.

Preschool Kingdom (Ages 3-5K): A fun place for children to play, create, worship, discover what it's like to be a friend with Jesus every day.

Adventure Camp (Grades 1-6): A creative place for elementary kids to use their imaginations and practice living out God's love in daily life. Also includes a hands-on community service project.
